 - 3. The candidates elected to serve three-year terms on the Ocean Pines Board of Directors are Steve Tuttle and Frank Daly. Candidates elected to serve one-year terms (due to resignation of elected Directors) are Ted Moroney and Esther Diller.

- 4. All ballots and associated envelopes will be kept for a period of one year in the locked OPA Elections Committee (EC) File cabinet in the Administration Building. The ballots and envelopes from the 2017 election have been discarded.
- 2. <u>Problems encountered with the tabulating and reporting system and any assistance required.</u> The counting process went very smoothly, ballots rejected by the Scantron machine were reviewed by the Elections Committee and counted if a determination could be made as to the clear intent of the voter.
- 3. A summary of Committee activities during the reporting period and any recommendations for improving the election or referendum process.

As part of the annual review of Resolution M-06, the EC discussed options as to when the voting results are annuanced. The EC made presentations at BOD work sessions and BOD meetings. It was the OPA BOD decision to annuance the ballot count results as soon as the ballot were counted.

The EC met eight times from November 2017 through September 2018. In addition, we hosted a candidate workshop with a draw for ballot order and one candidate forum.

Meeting agendas and meeting minutes were submitted to OPA and were posted as appropriate on the OPA website.

Board Director Slobodan Trendic was our liaison. He was able to attend most of our meetings and was of great help.

- 4. Recommendations, if any, for the calendar of events for the next election if the balloting was for the election of directors.
 - 1. Clarify the process of how a recount can be requested and completed if and when that situation occurs.
 - 2. Schedule candidate forums in the Assateague Room of the Community Center far in advance.
 - Candidate Draw and Workshop are scheduled to be held June 7, 2019 at 11:00 am in the Marlin Room,
 - The first Candidate Forum will be held at 7:00 9:00 pm on Wednesday June 12 in the Assateague Room and
 - The second Candidate Forum will be held 10 am noon on Saturday, June 22 in the Assateague Room.

- 3. Coordinate with the Candidate Search Committee and the Association Secretary to improve the recruiting and nomination process with particular attention on the Nomination Form that candidates use to apply for eligibility.
- 4. It is recommended that the BOD review any policies related to political/candidate ads in the OPA Quarterly newsletters. Further it the recommendation of the committee that all political, including BOD Candidate ads not be published in the newsletter.
- 5. <u>Comments on the capabilities of the contractor used and a recommendation regarding future use of the contractor or suggested alternatives.</u>

OPA engaged the service of two contractors in order to conduct the election.
