He also mentioned an upcoming webinar on SOX to be held January 31st that we can sign up for and attend virtually.
- Educational Signs for Route 90 Pond Patty Gamby updated us that Public Works no longer makes signs in-house. She is looking into another source. This project is being researched and hopefully signs will include local plants (including poison ivy) trees, fish, turtles, etc.
- Duck Crossing Signs Anne let us know about Public Works in Danville, Virginia's efforts to manufacture their signs, which we are looking to model ours. They were very responsive and informative. She will provide cost estimates at our next meeting.

• Patricia Garcia volunteered to write our next Green Street article due March 15th. She mentioned "plogging" as a way to successfully pick up trash while walking/jogging in Ocean Pines. It is a Swedish sustainable initiative which combines sports like jogging with caring for the environment.
