

Quilts of Valor Foundation®



The Quilts of Valor Foundation is a non-profit organization whose mission is "to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor."

Quilts of Valor was first organized in 2003 by Catherine Roberts, a Seaford, DE resident. Her son was deployed to Iraq and she was motivated to find a way to comfort those wounded by the conflict. A vision she had of a soldier being lifted from despair after being wrapped in a quilt left her with the message that "quilts = healing."

What a perfect pairing – The Wall that Heals with Quilts of Valor that heal. The Delaware Quilts of Valor is thankful for the opportunity to participate in this event; to share the mission of our organization and to award quilts to Vietnam Veterans.

Quilts of Valor has awarded over 270,000 quilts since it was formed. The organization relies solely on volunteers to piece, assemble, quilt, bind and award the quilts.

The Worcester County Veterans Memorial was dedicated May 30, 2005. The idea of building the memorial was conceived by members of this community, built by volunteers with much of the materials donated or discounted and to this day is supported, in its entirety, by donations. In 2005, the Worcester County Veterans Memorial Foundation at Ocean Pines, Inc. was created to care for it, in perpetuity. It is maintained by volunteers and receives its funding through memberships, donations, sales of bricks and pavers and fundraising efforts. It is through the efforts of volunteers, such as those who clean the memorial, raise and lower the flags and assist Ocean Pines Public Works, that this memorial continues to be a shining example of all that is good in our community.

This Veterans Memorial is a place of remembrance, comfort and education.

Many come here to sit and reflect on their loved ones, recalling the sacrifice they made so that we may be free. It is our duty to remember those servicemen and women who are honored here. Each year, at the Memorial site, a service is held on both Memorial Day and Veterans Day, at 11 a.m. to remember those who have served and those who gave all for us. In 2007, the Veterans Memorial Foundation established an Educational Outreach Program. The program brings every fifth grade student in Worcester County to the memorial where they are educated about the history of our armed services, flag history and respect for our flag. Every student is taught the proper handling of a flag, including how to fold it. Each student takes home an activity book containing history of the memorial and excerpts of all they learned during their visit. This book, created by the Foundation and supported by grants, is meant to be a conversation starter with their families. They are encouraged to return here with their families, and many do. The "Patriot's Pathway" was dedicated Veterans Day 2013 to further enhance the educational mission of the memorial, providing a brief history of U.S. involvement in historical conflicts. On September 21, 2019 we added a "Chair of Honor" to our memorial as a permanent reminder of those who were held captive and those who never returned from serving their country.
